The Murshid Nursing School started operating in a private rented building in Modern Cooperative Housing Society, Karachi, in July 1985 as a School of Nursing for girls only. The very next year in October 1986, the School of Nursing was recognized by Pakistan Nursing Council.

The graduation of the first batch of nurses was held in September 1988. After five years of operation, it was realized that training for the male nurses were as much needed as any female nurse and therefore with the approval of the Pakistan Nursing Council for the training of male staff was introduced in September 1991. The midwifery training was started by the school the next year in March 1992. To serve the community, Pupil Midwifery program started in 2008 which was transformed into a Community midwife two-year program in 2018.

Now, Murshid School of Nursing is offering degree programs to meet adequate standards of nursing practices by producing professionals under the category of Four Years Generic BSN, (since 2019) and Two Years of Post RN BSN program affiliated with Dow University of Health Sciences since 2017.

The construction work of Murshid Hospital, near Hub River, completed in 1987, but owing to a shortage of funds the School continued to function in the private building till 1994. The nursing school shifted to the adjacent building to the hospital premises when the school building along with hostel facilities was completed in 1995, the financial assistance for which was provided by the Government of Pakistan.

It has a covered area of 45,606 square feet (0.75 acres) with an attached hostel and a small garden enclosed within its boundaries.

The nursing school has a beautifully built premise which has all the required facilities and necessary equipment needed by any modern an institution built for the purpose. Students learn from highly qualified faculty with current industry experience, utilizing on-site state-of-the-art facilities.

As part of the program, students have the opportunity to work at various placement setups within the community & other hospitals. Some programs also offer opportunities to participate in inter-professional learning experiences, and local and international community service projects.
